When I first chose this topic I had no idea that it would be as difficult as it turned out to be to find the statistics on those who withdrew from the Wisconsin Synod before and after our split with the Missouri Synod. I must admit, that the research was rather interesting but it did become rather tedious at times.

I gathered the statitistics from a combination of sources. I received some information from President Naumann and then checked his information with that which is listed in the District Proceedings for the nine districts of the Synod. The District Proceedings were the main source of my information combined with the statistical reports of various years.

I'm sure that you will notice that the communicant count of withdrawing congregations is incomplete. Even by searching the statistical reports of those years this could not be determined accurately because, in some cases, a few people withdrew with the pastor, in other cases some members remained with the Wisconsin Synod by joining neighboring congregations or organized a new congregation.

You will also notice that some people who left came back as did a congregation here and there. I tried to note as many of these as was possible but I may have missed some who did return.

On the following pages you will find my findings as to the number of pastor, professors, teachers and

communicants who left our synod as a result of our fellowship with the Missouri Synod or because we broke fellowship with the Missouri Synod.

Some of the years are combined to make it easier to follow and some pastors left the synod in the year before they are listed because they are listed in the year that their withdrawal is reported.

It is very hard to draw any earthshaking conclusions from the material that I have gathered because the figures of the communicants are not as accurate as one would like them to be. I suppose one could have written to the congregations involved in withdrawals from the synod but that would hardly be worth the effort. The total number of communicants that we lost that I have is, I think, a fairly representive number although it may be a bit low.

It is clear from the statistics that, as a general rule, those who left WELS before 1961 did so because we did not break with Missouri sooner. Those who left before 1961 gererally, but not always, joined the little synod which former WELS men organized, the Confessional Lutherna Church. For a year or so after 1961 some were still going to CLC, but mostly they went to Missouri. Of course, this is speaking generally and there are always exceptions such as the congregations who left us and remained independent. There were also some pastors who retired and withdrew from WELS and then did not join with any synod.

It also seems to me that more pastors joined the CLC than did Missouri, but the total number of communicants is about equally divided. The larger congregations joined Missouri in most cases while in many other cases in regard to those who joined CLC the congregations split up and not all or even the majority of the members went with the pastor.

I suppose the thing that surprised me most in

compiling these statistics is the great number of pastors and communicants that did leave the WELS. For some reason I was under the impression that the total number was much smaller. Though the total number which left was not a very high percentage of the WELS it still must have been quite disturbing to many of the members of the Wisconsin Synod to see their brethern leaving fellowship with them.

One can also see the the Lord has richly blessed our synod in spite of those who left, in spite on the stife that may have been created because of our breaking or not breaking with the Missouri Synod. The Lord continually blessed our mission efforts at this time and many souls were added to His church. In 1961 our synod had congregations in only sixteen states and the number of states had grown to forty by 1973. It certainly is obvious that the Lord has blessed us beyond measure in this difficult time of withdrawal of congregations from our midsts. It must be said that many of these new mission fields were opened up by the families and groups of families that left the Missouri Synod during this time of unrest.

When we look at the statistics in this light it is readily apparent that no matter what it may cost in numbers, be it seven thousand or seventy thousand, a church body must stand fast on the pure doctrine of Scripture. Cost should never sway us to relinquish the truth of the Word of God. It is far, far better to lose a few who leave because we stand fast on Holy Scripture rather than sacrificing Scriptural principals washed.

placing the souls which are entrusted to our care in danger. Yes, it did cost our synod first because we did not break fellowship with Missouri and then because we did, but it might have cost us much more had we given in to either side and relinquished our pure doctrine.

What do the statistics that I have compiled prove? If they prove nothing else, they clearly show that God abundantly blesses those who stand fast on His Word in spite of the work of the devil, the pressures of this world, and the frailities of man.
